A Message from KGLP's Station Manager

While at the Navajo Nation Environmental Protection Agency (NNEPA) Conference in August, I was struck by the passion with which presenters and attendees expressed their concerns for ensuring that our descendents will dwell in a viable world. Keynote speaker Dr. Karlotta Chief and others spoke of climate change as an observable phenomenon that cannot be brushed aside in the name of corporate vitality.



Navajo Nation President Ben Shelly and various presenters shared the Nation's concerns about improving water quality and supplies, developing sustainable energy such as solar and wind, finding

cleaner approaches to petrochemical sources, removing contamination from abandoned uranium mines (AUMs), air pollution from unpaved roads, and more. President Shelly also emphasized that the Navajo Nation must increase its autonomy and self-reliance. (The Nation is now operating at a zero deficit.)

Sustainability will be an ongoing theme for KGLP's Fall Fundraiser. During the week of Monday, October 17 through Saturday, October 22, guests from Gallup Solar, the CSA (Community Sustained Agriculture) group

Adriel Heisey is an aerial photographer and professional pilot with a long history in the Four Corners area. He is currently one of the Navajo government's full time executive pilots, and his daily flights out of Window Rock take him all over the region and across the country. He has flown for the Navajo Nation since 1985, starting midway through Peterson Zah's first term as Navajo Tribal Chairman less than a year after moving to the reservation from his home state of Pennsylvania. The thousands of hours he has spent aloft over the extraordinary landscape of Navajoland and the greater Southwest have inspired him to pursue his passion for aerial photography to an uncommon degree. He built his own lightweight airplane in 1991 just for photography, and within a few years his images were published in a number of regional magazines, culminating in a cover story on the Four Corners in the September 1996 issue of *National Geographic*. Since that time he has shot a number of magazine assignments (including more work for *National Geographic*), exhibited his fine art prints in galleries and museums across the country, and published four books – all aerials.

Adriel lives in Gallup with his wife, Holly Rainier, who is a L&D nurse at GIMC. Together they operate his studio in support of his ongoing activities, which include the recent publication of a major new book, *The Rio Grande: An Eagle's View*, marketing his fine art prints, and new aerial cinematography capability. Adriel will present a lively program of highlights from his many years of work in the area, with a fascinating look at his aircraft and working techniques, and as well as a glimpse of his new Rio Grande project. *[PHOTO AND TEXT COURTESY OF ADRIEL HEISEY]*

and others will be discussing ways in which our community can improve the environment, reduce waste, increase self-reliance, and clean the planet.

We'll also be asking for your help to sustain KGLP, not only through your contributions of money, but through the giving of your time, where practical.

KGLP's Spring Fundraiser was very successful, with almost \$14,000 donated, surpassing the results of the Fall 2010 campaign by about seventy percent.

(See the graph on the next page for an idea of how significant that increase in community support was, when compared with previous fundraisers).

We hope that the Fall Membership Campaign will surpass that figure, showing Congress how important public radio is to the Gallup area as further calls are made to slash federal funding for such services.

A few of you, whether pledging financial support for KGLP or not, might volunteer to answer the phones during our Fall Pledge Drive sometime, during the week of October 17 through the 22nd. Perhaps you might encourage local businesses to sponsor KGLP shows.

Maybe one of you or someone you know has some publishing or public relations experience. We could use your assistance in putting together our newsletter (we're hoping to send out these at least four times per year, but are not there yet.)

Some of you might know of a potential production assistant who is good with computers or audio recording, willing to volunteer several hours per week learning to prepare public service announcements and promotional announcements for air.

Eventually, we'll need folks to help with staging remote broadcasts. Perhaps you have a friend who is great at repairing electrical gadgets, and might be willing to help maintain our studio equipment.

(We have a wonderful contract engineer who handles our transmitter-related equipment issues, and will likely be involved with studio upgrades, but we welcome ex-

perienced technicians who might wish to volunteer at the studios from time to time.)

Maybe you might help with special events, staffing KGLP's table or organizing fundraisers. Gallup Public Radio's Board of Directors and I would love to speak with you. Maybe you might wish to serve on the Board of Directors.

Maybe you're an aspiring community reporter, willing to spend the time needed to become a news or public affairs producer. Perhaps you could do interviews for Friday Forum or develop your own public affairs program, or record events in the area for later air.

Our community and our planet are sustainable only through rethinking how we use our resources. KGLP is sustainable only through support from our community, whether through donations of time or money. How can you improve the world, and perhaps help continue this valuable concern that is public radio in Gallup?

Yes, we have a dedicated board of directors.

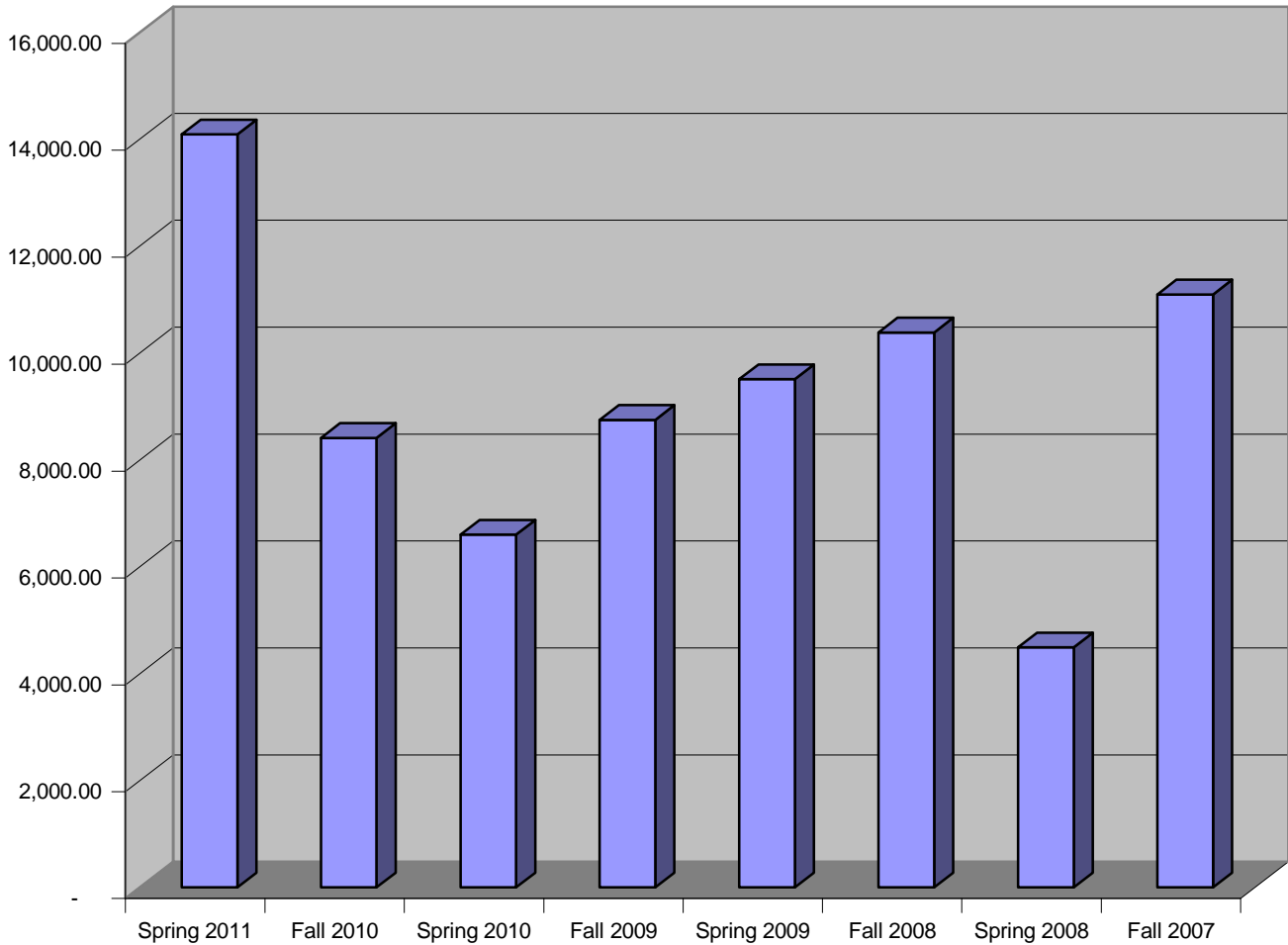
Yes, we have a number of loyal financial supporters.

**KGLP FUND DRIVE COMPARISON**



KGLP’s members set a new record during the Spring 2011 Fundraiser, with contributions totaling around 70 percent more than in the Fall of 2010, and about 34 percent more than our highest previous result, from the Fall 2007 fundraising campaign, as graphically presented above.

We can’t assume that our Fall fundraiser will be as successful, but as you can see in the graph, your donations to Gallup Public Radio do count, at any amount.

By the end of this year, we hope that the Fall Fundraising Campaign will bring in at least \$15,000...anything over that will help with getting online streaming restored, improving our production computers and other broadcast equipment, and enhance other aspects of our operation.

Also, inserted along with this newsletter, most of you will find a contribution form that includes a section for your feedback on ANYTHING related to KGLP.
