November six's elections. Why vote for KGLP with your time, your money, or even your well wishes?

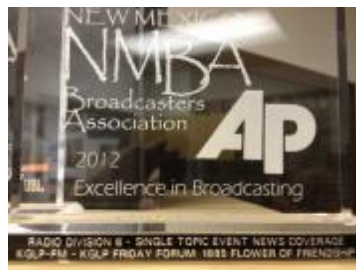

After Sam Tsosie left the board, Loree Monroe answered the call for board nominations issued in KGLP's Spring 2012 newsletter, and was appointed. Recently, Ray Calderon was also appointed to the board.

Board member terms are staggered. The board established the following years that terms will expire based on when they joined the board, or, in the case of appointees, by consensus:

December 2012 – terms expire for President Ron Donkersloot, Vice- President Carol Sarath, Secretary Gary Schuster, and newly appointed board member Raymond Calderon. December 2012 – December 2014 would be the next length of term for this group.

December 2013 – terms expire for treasurer Mildred Dunning, as well as for board members Gerald O'Hara, Fitz Sargent, and Loree Monroe. December 2013 – December 2015 would be the next length of term for this group.

The election may be conducted by mail, though email is another option for those members who notify KGLP of that desire, by emailing manager@kglp.org. (Members will likely see ballots in December's mail or email.) Anyone who has or will have contributed time and/or money to KGLP between October 2011 and November 2012 will be eligible to vote in the board elections. All feedback supported continuing KGLP's broadcasts of Marian McPartland's Piano Jazz program. Loyal listeners pointed to the breadth of important guests whose appearances will be featured from archives that will be heard in the coming months and years. Car Talk is in a similar position, having ceased new episode production but continuing with a wide variety of archived programs that will be rebroadcast in the coming months and years. Pipe Dreams has been scheduled since the end of St. Paul Sunday, and KGLP has been airing a variety of specials ranging from the El Morro Open Mic and Children's awards to the Poverty Tour and 3-month series such as the Salzburg Festival, America's Music Festivals, Russian Accents, or the current series, Santa Fe Music Festival, which airs Monday evenings at seven through December 17 of this year. Presidential Debates happen next on Thursday, October 11, Tuesday, October 16, and Monday, October 22, all from 7 until 9 p.m.

From recruitment of area volunteers of all ages for public affairs, news, and music, to enhancing your on-air and online experience of our varied communities, KGLP wants to be YOUR public radio station.

We have received largely positive feedback on changes implemented since the Gallup Public Radio Board of Directors hired me for duties beginning in early 2011. I have been touched by the number of people in KGLP's listening area who have welcomed me here, and have expressed some satisfaction in the direction that your public radio station has taken over the last 21 months or so.

A number of you have become my friends, and I thank you for your support of me, personally, and of public radio in Northwestern New Mexico and Northeastern Arizona.

Earlier this year, as mentioned in the Spring 2012 newsletter, Gallup Public Radio received an award from the New

Mexico Broadcasters Association, NMBA, as one of the "2011 Broadcaster of the Year" honorees.

In June, KGLP received another award from the NMBA, for a one-hour topical news program covering events with the BNSF Railway and the Pueblos of Acoma and Laguna that commemorated "The Flower of Friendship" agreement of 1885, which led to rights-of-way for the railroad of that time in exchange for jobs and other opportunities for the tribal members of the Pueblos.

This relationship was explored during short trips over two consecutive days in a set of business cars, *The BNSF Special*, where I was privileged to speak with a number of individuals from both Pueblos about their family histories with the railroad. I also spoke with tribal leaders and railroad representatives in order to better share this experience with KGLP's listeners.

In early November, I will be one of ten folks in our area honored with a community service award from Gallup's new *Rainbow Center*, one of the few GLBT

resource centers in New Mexico, largely due to local interview segments and community outreach with public service announcements that KGLP has been producing.

I want to emphasize here that KGLP is accepting of a very diverse community, ranging from local churches to the Navajo Nation, and we wish to partner with a variety of area organizations in order to collaborate on improvements to the area's quality of life and socio-economic development. But we do need help in order to continue that work.

In July, Gallup Public Radio hired Autumn Chacon as a half-time technical assistant to help better serve our listeners. I first met Autumn when I was asked to join the advisory board for KNIZ, 90.1 FM, a new community radio station in Gallup. Autumn is the Vice-President of the Available Media, Inc. board of directors, and comes to us with several years of experience in media, mostly with an open-access cable TV station in Albuquerque. Some of you may hear

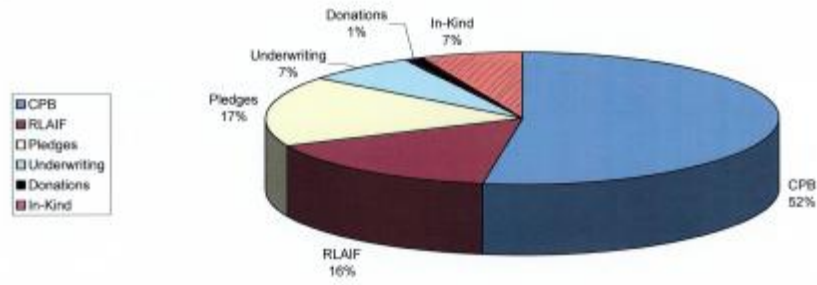
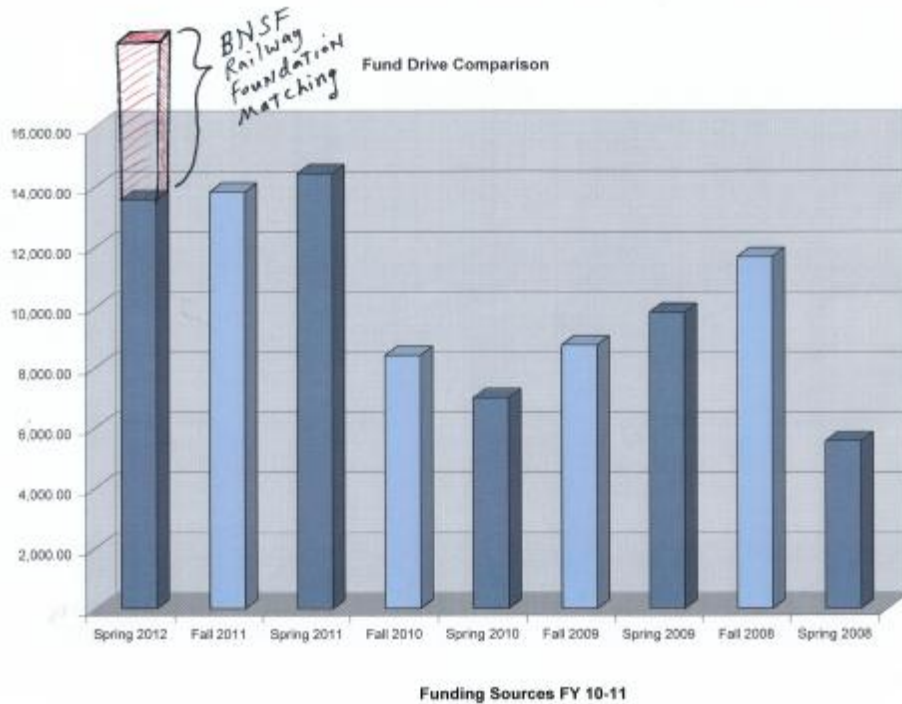
Autumn's public service announcements from time to time as they air on KGLP.

Autumn, who helps with daily operations and production at KGLP, is also a performance artist who was in Toronto last month for a reception and live performance launching her installation at the Art Gallery of Ontario, which she developed with Toronto resident Lisa Myers. This event, "Noise Cooking", involved food preparation while electronically processing the sounds of that endeavor into an avant-garde melee of dissonance.

All their kitchen utensils were "mic'ed", amplifying the sounds of preparing a meal, from scraping avocados to peeling carrots. When Myers, who is a chef and musician, sliced a vegetable, the resulting sound was industrial and yet almost organic.

The Toronto exhibition runs through Oct. 28, and was part of Planet IndigenUS, a festival of indigenous culture that took place in August, 2012.

KGLP’s members gave almost as much during the Spring 2012 Fundraiser as during the Fall 2011 Pledge Drive. The overall results from the Spring 2012 fundraiser approached \$20,000 largely due to the BNSF Railway Foundation’s matching donation (any contribution of \$100 or more during the week of October 15 through October 22 will also be matched by BNSF Railway Foundation until a total of \$5,000 has been received. Keep in mind that anyone donating any amount will help broker our national funding, which, as is the case with the BNSF Railway Foundation, is directly tied to our local fundraising success. CPB, for example, specifically requires adequate local funding in order to qualify for grants that help pay for our network programs from NPR, NV1, Pacifica Radio, American Public Media, Public Radio International, and more. In addition, your dollars bolster our daily operations. For example, Gallup Public Radio wouldn’t have a station manager, let alone streaming, without you.) Vehicle donations helped exceed KGLP’s Spring goals.

On the technical front, the Public Radio Satellite System is planning to replace KGLP's aging fiberglass satellite dish on the roof of UNMG's Gurley Hall with a shiny new aluminum model by the Spring of 2013, at about the same time that our station license comes up for renewal.

The upgrade will not cost Gallup Public Radio anything, however, there is a complication: KGLP's microwave antenna for our Studio-Transmitter-Link (STL), through which our signal is conveyed to Gibson Peak for broadcast, is part of the satellite dish assembly, and will be out of service while the dish upgrade is in progress. If no other option were available, this procedure would take KGLP off the air for between half a day up to a couple of days.

As it happens, UNMG's one-year computer network upgrade that started this past June has already resulted in internet service to Gibson Peak through which UNMG will be able to share data with the Zuni campus, Navajo Technical College in Crownpoint, and perhaps other locations. A side benefit should include access by KGLP to that connection. Why is that helpful? Well, current technology includes digital devices called Audio-over-IP codecs, a more sophisticated variant on the "Voice-Over-IP", or VOIP, technology that allows users to make phone calls over the internet using services such as Skype, Vonage, Magic Jack, and others.

KGLP has purchased one of these codecs for the studio, for \$1,500, and will purchase an identical until for the transmitter site. Once installed, KGLP's programming can be routed to the transmitter over a broadband internet connection.

This will allow KGLP to stay on the air during the satellite dish upgrade, and in the long term, serve as a

backup connection, so that if we ever have a problem such as the last year's, where our signal suffered sporadic outages until we could finagle tower climbers and access to repair our STL's microwave antenna at the Gibson Peak transmitter site.

The capabilities of this system allow for remote broadcasts as well. In other words, if we wanted to cover the City Council, a music concert, or other events throughout the region, if not the country, we could broadcast live, assuming that we have permission.

Recently, the Navajo Nation Broadcast Services Department in Window Rock got their television broadcasts going again, and when they don't have a video program airing, they are now airing KGLP's programming, typically in the evening and overnight.

We still have plans for a major website upgrade, and will replace our aging automation system next year.
