### A Message from KGLP's Station Manager

While there are larger public radio stations running on-air fundraisers three or four times each year, in order to sustain a larger paid staff, KGLP continues to chug along rather modestly with two weeks of on-air pledge drives each year. We won't inconvenience our

listeners any more than is absolutely necessary.

Frankly, if a few people or foundations could consistently donate enough to get us about \$35,000 per year, we would not have to interrupt any of our programming for an on-air fundraiser. At this time, it is necessary to have two weeks of on-air fundraising each year in order to ensure around \$35,000 in listener contributions annually. Many of these are faithful members' donations. come from new members, responding to our on-air requests for support. Some pledges come from members who have given regularly, and some from listeners who haven't donated for a couple of years. Know that we are happy to have a pledge from any of our listeners, and for any amount. It is good to hear from you all, even if you call mainly to give us feedback, get information, or even RSVP for the April 23rd member appreciation event!

While 2013 funding will be less than in 2012, it will still be higher than what Gallup Public Radio had in 2011, since our CPB funding is actually higher now, even with the sequester, than it was two years ago. Still, we simply did not have the confidence in our financing to continue a half-time position into the new year, and so at this point KGLP's staff consists of myself and our volunteers who host shows and help with preparation of our programs for air.

We are not in a static situation. Funding varies a bit from year to year, and from fundraiser to fundraiser. Our contributing members bolster funds for our daily operations, while demonstrating community support that helps with our grant applications. We are here to serve each and every one of you, as well as those listeners who have not been able to donate to the cause of public radio.

Yes, the next on-air fundraising week is coming up shortly, from Monday, April 22, through Saturday, April 27, 2013. We will be offering that listener appreciation performance by Civil War songster Jed Marum at 7pm this Tuesday, April 23, over at El Rancho Hotel's 49'er Lounge, and I hope that some of you will be able to join us.

## Programming and Engineering Notes:

### Latino USA, Peace Talks, and 12th Street Jump, & EarthSky

*Note: KGLP will be off the air for several days in May (hopefully NOT "Seven Days in May"! Our aging satellite dish is being replaced by the Public Radio Satellite System folks - we expect to be off the air for between one and three days, but our online stream will continue. Some programs MAY be affected during that time, since we will not have our regular satellite feeds.)* **In programming,**

- 1) Latino USA will soon expand to one hour (date to be announced when we know).
- 2) We are considering expanding Peace Talks to one hour for air Fridays at 2pm when 1) happens.
- 3) Check out a new program, 12th Street Jump, Saturdays 9-10pm...details at KGLP.org
- 4) The EarthSky Features end production in late May - Isla Earth features might then air daily.

Admission is free to current KGLP members, and we won't turn away walk-ins, so long as seats are available. If you haven't donated to Gallup Public Radio for a couple of years, why not make a pledge and reserve your free ticket? (said tickets will be at the "will call" table, i.e., in my hands at the El Rancho Hotel by around 6:30pm on Tuesday, April 23rd - I'll leave KGLP for my desk duty as soon as Gerald O'Hara and I finish our on-air "pitching" at six that evening... Where couples are members, two free tickets will be provided.)

The first ten people who donate \$200 or more next week may choose from one of Be Sargent's paintings (see Page 9). Last Fall we gave away all of Be's last set of ten donated paintings in the first two days of the fundraiser. Those donating \$200 or more are also eligible for a Day Sponsorship, a shout-out of sorts that will air at least ten times on the day specified. (Recently Carol Sarath made use of two accumulated Day Sponsorships which you may hear, or have heard, on April 16 or 17.)

There's one other ticket give-away, though not as convenient for most Gallupians: We have a few printed tickets for the "Wait, Wait, Don't Tell Me" cinema events at the Cottonwood 16 theaters in Albuquerque, on Thursday, May 2nd, at 7pm, and on Tuesday, May 7th, at 7:30pm. This is a nationwide broadcast to theaters featuring a visually realized edition of NPR's Wait, Wait, Don't Tell me, which airs Saturday evenings at seven on KGLP. Anyone who calls

and requests them may receive between one and five tickets for one of these screenings, though, again, the events are on weekday evenings in Albuquerque. Well, so much for give-aways and gifts. Now here's what changed this year:

The Federal sequestration, or "Fiscal Cliff" now in place is really more of a "Fiscal Slope", meaning that while no one is falling over the edge, it does make it a bit harder for non-profit organizations and services to keep their footing. For KGLP, it means that we are expecting to receive about \$7,000 less this year from the Corporation for Public Broadcasting, CPB, than we did in 2012.

That's around four percent of our 2012 funding, with BNSF Railway Foundation's matching donations of \$10,000 being about five percent of last year's funding. We do not expect a matching donation for the Spring fundraiser, and we cannot assume that we'll have one this fall, though we really appreciate the gift of matching donations from BNSF Railway Foundation last year.

With careful budgeting, we may eventually be able to hire a student or two for five to ten hours each week, and are just beginning to get some queries about this, as well as volunteer opportunities (and volunteers really are the backbone of many community radio stations, including ours...

While not volunteers, students in UNM-Gallup's Spring 2013 Radio/TV class have recorded a number of public service announcements (PSAs), adding their voices to KGLP's schedule, while getting some academic credit in the process. Alyssa and Ameriss, two of KGLP's more experienced Youth Radio volunteers, have also produced PSAs that have aired. You may even have been surprised at the sound of some young scouts informing you about school delays in recent months...it did get your attention, though!

We are always looking for community members willing to give their time for the betterment of Gallup Public Radio's service to our listeners, whether helping with the newsletter (we would love to publish more frequently!), helping with events, program preparation, on-air announcements, or even news gathering and public affairs shows. In a largely rural area such as ours, we value any help that we can get. The most important thing that KGLP can provide is good quality and consistent news, music, and public affairs, as well as engagement with our community.

Engagement may take the form of a listener appreciation event, PSAs, public affairs programming with local organizations, or simply letting you all know what's coming up through on-air

promos, Facebook posts, and updates to KGLP.org.

Our fundraisers are also a form of community engagement. When you make a pledge, you also can let us know how we're doing, make suggestions, or raise concerns about particular issues. A change in processing terminals now allows us to take any credit card, and so you can dig out your Discover, American Express, Diner's Club, or the usual Visa or Mastercard. While I don't expect anyone to donate with a JCP (Japanese Credit Bureau) card, who knows what online listeners might prefer!

On Page 8 of this newsletter, you will find a program feedback form, should you care to rate the programming that you listen to on KGLP. You could mail us the form at your leisure, or include it with your membership renewal when you're ready. (The form for that is on Page 7.)

Gallup Public Radio, including the board, staff, and volunteers of KGLP, do appreciate our listeners, and do appreciate our contributing members, who help us keep this service up and running.

For KGLP, Member appreciation is about doing our job, and providing the best programming services and broadcasts that we can with our limited resources.

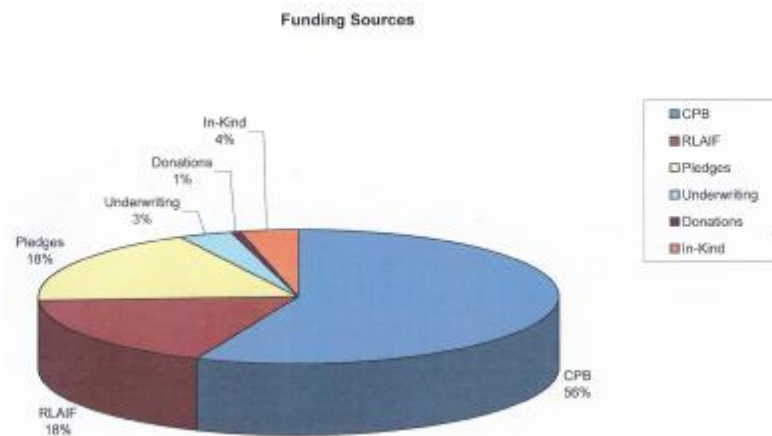
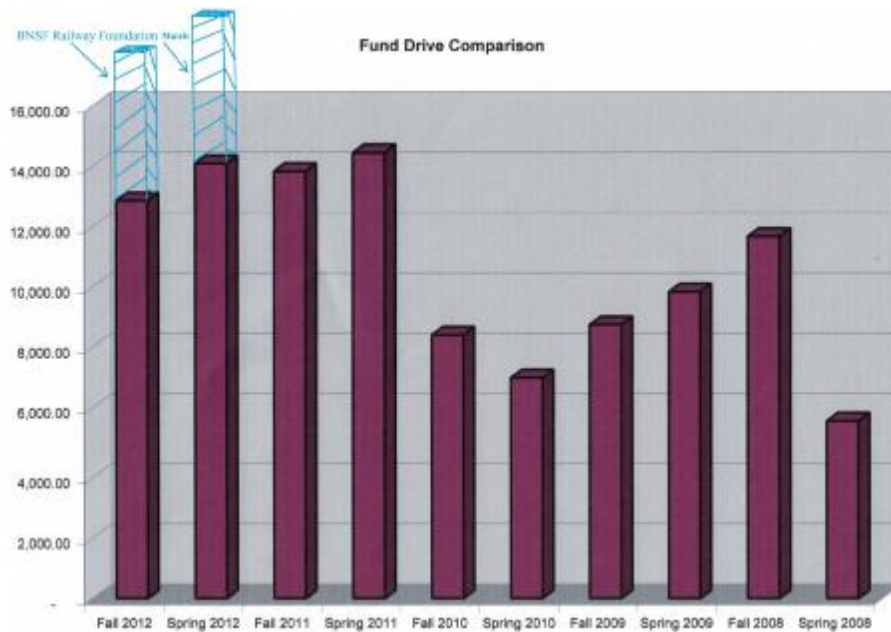

While Fall 2012 donations were a little lower than in the previous three fundraisers, our listeners have been pledging significantly more over the last two years than in the previous four years. Success in obtaining outside funding is directly tied to our local fundraising success. CPB, for example, specifically requires adequate local funding in order to qualify for grants that help pay for our network programs from NPR, NV1, Pacifica Radio, American Public Media, Public Radio International, and more. In addition, your dollars bolster our daily operations. For example, Gallup Public Radio wouldn't have a station manager, let alone streaming, without you.) Vehicle donations helped achieve KGLP's 2012 goals, and the BNSF Railway Foundation's matching donations helped us surpass all previous local fundraising efforts. We don't have BNSF's matching this Spring, and so KGLP depends on listener support as much as ever.

On page 8, you will see a programming survey. Also, inserted along with this newsletter, most of you will find a contribution form (as well as on Page seven, for convenience) that includes a section for your feedback on ANYTHING related to KGLP, whether you donate or not.
